When to use it:	Future in time	Future time tables	Habits	Short actions Now	Always True	Permanent situations
Examples:	Our taxi arrives at 10 O' clock	l won't paint the house <u>until</u> it gets warmer.	l brush my teeth everyday.	She runs the race and wins.	Water boils at 100 degrees.	I live in the Netherlands.
	We take off this evening.	We can use: Until, as soon as, before or after.	l go to gym twice a week. Twice a week, often, on Mondays, sometimes.	She hits the ball and misses	Four plus four is eight.	



Present Continuous

When to use it:	Irritating habbits	Definate future plans	Tempory habits	Unfinished actions happening now	Tempory situations	
Examples	You are always loosing your bank card	l am leaving soon.	He's gyming alot lately.	l am speaking now.	I am living in the Netherlands	
	He is constantly hitting his head on there!	l am meeting Sharon later.	She is eating alot less these days.	She is working at the moment.	l am working here this week.	



Present perfect

When to use it:	How long	Unfinished time word	Present result	News and recent events	Life experience	
Finished		I haven't seen her this year. I have been to the library this week.	l have lost my car keys. (l cannot get into my car)	The Queen has died. The Prince has been sick recently.	l have been to Thailand. I have never been to Thailand.	
Unfinished	I have known Sarah since she was a child. I have worked here for 10 years.					



Present perfect continous

When to use it:	Present Result	How long
Unfinished		I have been seeing him for 2 years.
		TEMPORY SITUATION:
		I have been going to the gym alot recently.
Finished	I have been gyming alot. (That is why my body is sorry now)

When to use it:	Finished time word/Finished time period	The news	Actions in stories	Unreal/ imaginary things
Present future				If I won the lottery, I would travel around the world.
Past	Finished time word:I went to dinner last night.(last night, in 2005, 2 months ago)	He had a car crash. He has died. (Use with present perfect)	He jumped in and swam to the other side.	
	Finished time period: Nelson Mandela was the president of South Africa.		(Use with the past continuous)	



Past continuous

When to use it:	Overlapping Action	Story Background	Some past habits	How long - action
	I was walking in the park when I saw Sarah.	The dogs were barking, so she turned her music down.	She was always singing in those days.	l was working for hours.
	I was sitting in the train when I got robbed.		She was forever gardening.	l was fixing the bike all evening.



Past perfect

When to use it:	Unreal things in the past	How long to a point in the past	One event finished before another past event
	l wish I hadn't read my book all night.	When he got that job, he had been in the Netherlands for 4 years.	When we arrived and the film had started.
	We use: Wish / Third conditional		When + past simple, past perfect



Past perfect continuous

When to use it:	How long to a point in the past	Result at a time in the past
	She had been going to that gym when she met John.	The tissue was wet, she had been crying.
	He/she/it/ they had been + verb(ing) + when + past simple	Use with: Past simple



Future Simple

When to use it: **Future Plans and Promises / Future Future Predicitons** Intentions Conditionals prediction requests/ refusals/ offers Will: -The sun will set I will help you If it isn't cold, at 6pm. move house. we will go swimming. - I think Donald I will help you fix this. lf it doesn't trump will win the next work, we will American get a new one. election. The box is Going to: A) We have no more coffee. getting heavier B) I know, I am and heavier, it going to get is going to break. some more today.



Future continuous

How to use it:	Over lapping action	Future as a matter of course	
	I will be watching a movie when you get here.	The queen will be making a speech tonight.	
	Can also use:	The president will be visiting the city centre next week.	



Future perfect simple

When to use it:		Action finished before a point in the future
	When I get married, I will have known Sarah for 8 years.	By 4 O'clock I will have finished work.



Future perfect continuous

How to use it:	How long to a point in the future	Action finished before a point in the future
	In June, she will have been walking for two years.	When I get there, I will have been flying for 10 hours. (I will be very tired)
	Use with: when + present simple, by the time + present simple, for + time.	
		when + present simple, by the time + present simple
